StarLine

Commissioned for the Veterans Memorial Plaza at the Voice of America Centre, West Chester, Ohio, *StarLine* is dynamic, triangulated energy. Like the linear radio structures that once surrounded the Voice of America site, this star is symbolic of both the past and the future, of freedom, friendship, and communication. It represents something intangible and ethereal, transcending space and time, yet familiar. Through this abstracted reference to the 5-pointed star of the American flag, with its multiple views drawn in the round, the suspended horizontal line floats and sways within the star, pointing toward the west, reminding us that a line can be a path or direction of movement, or a boundary, or a connection—that Radio Free Europe and the Voice of America were essential resources for information and courage during times of 20th century oppression.



Susan Ewing earned her M.F.A. in Jewelry Design and Metalsmithing with Distinction from Indiana University, Bloomington. She was a member of the Miami University of Ohio faculty from 1981 to 2016, and served as University Distinguished Professor for more than 10 years. Ewing was awarded Miami University's highest honor, the Benjamin Harrison Medallion.
